First Aid Incident Risk Injury becoming more serious without treatment due to lack of procedure	Young People Leaders Visitors Staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All visiting groups, in accordance with POR, will have their own designated First Aider; in the event of a major incident, Linnet Clough will provide additional support. • With serious life threatening injuries eg. where CPR is required or excessive bleeding the need to put on COVID PPE should be ignored until a second First Aider suitably wearing PPE can take over. • Minor Injuries requiring First Aid treatment takes priority over COVID requirements subject to control measures being put in place ie.PPE including mask, visor, disposable gloves, and apron. • Activity Instructors must take a First Aid kit in addition to a Covid PPE kit, including necessary PPE and radio or phone with them when leading an activity that is remote from the administrative area. • First Aid boxes must be used in conjunction with a Covid PPE kit containing appropriate PPE mask, visor, disposable gloves, and apron and to be available in the downstairs canteen, Reception and in the Defibrillator box • Groups must also have their own First Aid Kits. • A specific note MUST be made in the accident report book that social distancing procedures had to be broken with the name of the person who undertook the First Aid 	
First Aid Incident Risk Injury becoming more serious due to lack of treatment. and spread of infection due to social distancing and hygiene requirements	Young People Leaders Visitors Staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If appropriate the injured person should where possible treat themselves after washing hands or sanitizing with alcohol Gel. • Only one First Aider should attend unless the accident is serious • As a minimum the injured person should be asked to wear a mask unless the patient has a facial injury or difficulty in breathing. • First Aider to sanitise hands wear disposable gloves, mask, visor and apron and treat in line with normal first aid procedures.

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> With more serious injuries when any necessary immediate first aid has been carried out the patient should be transferred either back to their group or to the downstairs canteen for further treatment or to await transfer to hospital. If possible, the first aider should not touch the wound or any part of the dressing that contacts the wound directly. If CPR is required a resuscitator is to be used or if not available chest compressions as per normal procedure. Any other party unable or unwilling to leave the patient is to wear face covering. A specific note MUST be made in the accident report book that social distancing procedures had to be broken with the name of the person who undertook the First Aid
